RESOLUTION : With the coming into force of the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961 and the consequent increase in the work of the Collectors and the Prant Officers, it has become necessary to revise the orders which have been issued in the past prescribing the minimum number of appeals filed under the Bombay Tenancy and Agricultural Lands Act, 1948 which these officers are expected to dispose of and also to prescribe similar quota for disposal of enquiries under sections 14 to 21 of the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961 by them. Government is therefore, pleased to direct that the Collectors and the Prant Officers should dispose of during a month the following minimum number of appeals under the Bombay Tenancy and Agricultural Lands Act, 1948 and enquiries under sections 14 to 21 of the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961.

2. Government is also pleased to direct that if in any district the Special Deputy Collectors (Tenancy Appeals) have been asked to supervise the work of the Tribunals, they should be relieved of such supervision work.

The Commissioners of Divisions are requested to call for the monthly figures of disposal of appeals/enquiries of the officers concerned and if they find that the rate of disposal of any officer has fallen below the above mentioned limits without proper justification they should report the matter to Government with suitable recommendations in the matter.
